SDRCA Member Code of Ethics:

T24 Changes Delayed

SACRAMENTO - The California Energy Commission unanimously approved revising the effective date for the 2013 Building Energy Efficiency Standards from January 1, 2014 to July 1, 2014.

The revised effective date was approved for two reasons: 1) to enable the Energy Commission to release customized software that has a complete set of features and suite of tools that the building industry can use to comply with the 2013 Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Title 24, Part 1, Chapter 10 and Part 6, and affected provisions in Part 11 [Cal. Green Building Standards Code]); and 2) to provide the industry and local building departments more time to prepare for and become familiar with the Standards. The open source software is the most sophisticated to date, uses new advances in building analytics and will be significantly more accurate when calculating savings.

The Energy Commission will use the additional time to provide more information on the Standards and work with California's utilities, building industry and building departments to provide training on the software and new Standards. Implementing the Standards with software that is not fully functional puts property owners and the building industry in an untenable situation and could lead to delays in project design and permitting.

The public domain compliance software for residential buildings has been available since July 2013 and developers have been using it to comply with and exceed the new standards. The public domain compliance software for nonresidential buildings was released in September 2013. The Energy Commission adopted the 2013 Standards on May 31, 2012, and the California Building Standards Commission approved them on January 23, 2013.

The California Building Standards Commission will consider this issue at their December 18 business meeting.

Bylaw Amendment Accepted At Annual Meeting

ARTICLE 4. MEMBERSHIP

Qualification. This corporation shall have three classes of membership, denoted as Regular Members, Associate Members, and Certified Contractor Members. Regular Members shall be limited to an individual, partnership, corporation or other entity holding an active C-39 contractor's license issued by the State of California (or any successor permit or license) and who has an office or other business presence in San Diego County, and provides current certificates of Liability and Workers' Compensation insurance policies. Associate Members shall be limited to an individual, partnership, corporation or other entity, which is engaged in activities which are related to, or associated with, the roofing contracting business in San Diego County, and who are approved for membership by the Board. Certified Contractor Members shall be limited to an individual, partnership, corporation or other entity holding an active C-39 contractor's license issued by the State of California (or any successor permit or license) and who has an office or other business presence in San Diego County, provides current certificates of Liability and Workers' Compensation insurance policies, and meets the following requirements:

A. Community Service – At least 2 community service projects must be performed annually, or, participate in the SDRCA Annual Build-A-Roof project. To receive credit for a community service project other than the SDRCA Annual Build-A-Roof, a news article, press release, thank you letter, or other types of evidence shall be submitted to the SDRCA to receive credit.

B. Association Participation - Each member must attend at least half of the SDRCA Dinner Meetings held each calendar year. Sending a representative from the member's company will qualify for an attendance.

C. Education - Each member must provide the SDRCA with at least 4 documents of proof of attending or employees attending an educational program, Attending SDRCA Dinner Meetings does not satisfy this requirement. Examples of an education program that meets this requirement would be any training or educational program the SDRCA provides, or programs by other roofing industry organizations, such as Manufacturer Certifications, Supplier Demonstrations, WSRCA programs, NRCA programs. Other types of education can be submitted to the membership committee for review and may be considered a valid act of education.

D. Safety - Each member must attend at least two (2) of the safety programs provided by the SDRCA, or, provide evidence of the member's safety program. A current and ongoing safety program will meet this requirement.

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Bylaw Amendment Accepted At Annual Meeting (Continued)

Additional membership requirements for Certified Contractor Members may be established by the Board of Directors from time to time. Only Certified Contractor Members are eligible for consumer referrals.

The Board may create one or more subcategories of Associate Members and may charge different monthly dues for each category. Any person or organization meeting the requirements for membership, shall be eligible for membership on approval of the membership application by the Board and upon payment of any dues or fees fixed by the Board.

END OF BYLAW

The Certified Contractor Member category will take effect on January 1, 2015. Current Contractor Members will have 2014 to meet the listed requirements to obtain the Certified Contractor Member status and be eligible for referrals. There is no change to the referral process in 2014.

The SDRCA will be producing marketing materials in relationship to the Certified Contractor Member category for your use.
